Benefits Explained

Participate. Guaranteed places for team members from your organisation to participate in the Indaba.

Named scholarships. Student attendance scholarships named after your organisation.

Overview

Programme

- The Indaba will take place over 6 days, from 21 16 August 2022.
- The week will begin with tutorial sessions that are more introductory, showcase the work of participants at the research day, and close with more specialised topics across a series of workshops.
- Nile, Congo and Zambezi sponsors wishing to host independent evening receptions could do so on 22, 23, 24 or 25 March. We hope for these receptions to contain educational elements. *Dates to be coordinated with the organizing committee to avoid clashes.*
- The Indaba is co-located with the AI Hack Africa, a 3 day hackathon running from 29 31 August.

COVID19 Safety Approach

COVID continues to create organisational complexities. Your sponsorship also allows for testing and safety facilities, accommodation and travel extensions, and the provision for virtual engagement.

Before the Indaba

- Lower capacity than normal to allow distancing. We plan for a gathering of 300 people at most.*
- Opportunities for virtual participation will be made available.
- Compliance with the latest regulations for COVID19 stipulated by the Government of Tunisia, and the city of Tunis. Vaccination is required for entry to shops and venues, and all participants must therefore be vaccinated. This is in addition to any other visa requirements that are required.
- We will require travel insurance for all those whose in-person participation is confirmed.
- If global pandemic profile requires cancellation or postponement of the Indaba, this will be communicated as soon as possible and we plan to move to a fully-virtual format. Cancellation may incur costs and any funds remaining from sponsorship will be carried over to the new date.

*If the COVID19 risk profile is sufficiently low in August 2022, capacity may be increased to accommodate more students. We want to give as many students as possible the opportunity to participate!

During the Indaba

- Rapid SARS-CoV-2 antigen tests will be issued at check-in.
- Rapid tests for the start of each day; access to the venue will be dependent on a negative test.
- Mask wearing at all times.
- The conference typically has paramedics in place and has a safety plan that notes the closest local health facilities.

In Case of Positive Test

- Participant will go into isolation and no longer be allowed to attend sessions in person and encouraged to follow along virtually.
- The Indaba will work to support their stay (by adjusting return flights and extended accommodation stays).
- In the event that the individual's symptoms are alarming, they will receive medical attention from the healthcare service providers on-hand.
